



State of New York Society President Hisits Cable Carry Monuments

The original cable was used as an anchor rope for the enormous vessel, the Superior, which was stationed in Sackets Harbor in 1814. It was too big and heavy for a single cart so it was necessary to move the great cable on foot. The cable has been described as being 600 feet long, 6 inches thick and weighing 9,600 pounds. The entire carry took 3 days and once the cable reached its destination, volunteers were paid \$2.00 for their service and walked the long trip back to their homes in the Sixtown area [as told by Kamra Rowland, President, Whitney Hungerford Chapter, in the U.S.D. OF 1812 July 2012 issue, "Bicentennial Informer"]





"This trail is the route taken by the Americans who carried on their shoulders the huge cable needed on a frigate then under construction at Sackets Harbor. En route to that place with the cable, the Americans' ship was engaged in battle with the British at Sandy Creek. Although successful in the battle, they were forced to abandon their ship and proceed by road. As they were unable to load the cable in a wagon, they carried it the rest of the way on their shoulders." [published in an article titled, "War of 1812 Incident To Be Commemorated" Schenectady Gazette, Fri., May 9, 1930].

Three sites on the trail of the great cable carry are marked with monuments, and are located in Ellisburg, Smithville & Sackets Harbor. A dedication ceremony took place in 1930, and the monuments paid for by the State of New York Society, United States Daughters of 1812, and the NY State Historical Society. Credit should be given particularly to (then) State President, Mrs. Frank D. Callan. Mrs. Callan was NY's 3rd State President (1924-1932). The Northern Frontier Chapter of Jefferson County would oversee the care of the markers. Donation of the land was found as follows:

"Three sites had been donated to the Daughters of 1812 for placement of the markers. The first, in Ellisburg, was donated by H Edmund and Jennie Machold (Liber 427). The second, in Smithville, was donated by Scott and Clara Carpenter (Liber 427). The third, located in Sackets Harbor, was donated by William J. and Margaret M. Fields (Liber 427)." [published in "An Analysis of the Events Surrounding The Battle of Big Sandy and the Carrying of the Great Rope in 1814 and the Ensuing 185 Years", by Blaine Bettinger].

Said President Johnpier, "It is important that we make this pilgrimage. These men carried the cable with courage and conviction. It is our duty to commemorate and celebrate this history. But, more importantly, we must strive to keep this history alive for future generations to appreciate. Education is key. We must never forget the important acts of heroism and bravery that these men demonstrated."

Local events for the "official 200 year Anniversary" of the Great Cable Carry will take place the weekend of Sat./Sun., June 7th & 8th, 2014. There are plans for both local chapters, General Jacob Brown and Whitney-Hungerford, to participate. Three of its members, Beverly Sterling-Affinati, Anne Davis & Kamra Rowland, sit on the planning committee for the 2014 Cable Carry event, along with Elaine Scott, Don Whitney, Debbie



Archeology and the Second Battle of Sackets Harbor:

Why the Militia Deserves Its Due

Archeologists working at Sackets Harbor (Hartgen Archeological Associates, Inc. 2009)

During the War of 1812, Sackets Harbor, New York served as the principal American shipbuilding facility on Lake Ontario. A rag-tag team of volunteers, militia, and American regulars repulsed attacking British-Canadian forces in May 1813. The battle left numerous casualties, American ships and stores burned, and no clear victor. Later testimonies placed some of the blame for British advances on the American volunteers who "rose from their cover and fled." A soldier at the battle later remarked, however, that "the truth is never more than half told--that the most important held back." The presenter directed an archeological study of the battlefield sponsored by the National Park Service. Metal detecting and later high-tech analyses of the artifacts provide alternative archeological evidence at odds with the historical record. A PowerPoint presentation illustrates the history of the battle, the archeological fieldwork and analysis, and the recovered artifacts.
